SERVICE SPECIFICATION - HORTICULTURE, ARBORICULTURE, PLAYGROUND SUPPLIES AND HIRE OR OUTRIGHT SUPPLY OF PARKS MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT

1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1** The London Borough of Haringey (LBH) is committed to providing value-for-money services, improving quality at lower cost, and delivering a cleaner, greener Borough. The drafting of this Specification is seen as an exciting opportunity to enhance both quality and value for money of the current service.
- 1.2** The London Borough of Haringey Parks and Leisure Service strive to provide good and continually improving service for all members of our communities which are measurable through external and internal customer satisfaction levels.
- 1.3** All LBH Parks Service employees must ensure a positive commitment to quality and respond quickly and effectively to achieve the performance standards that are required of them and to 'get it right, first time' and therefore LBH expects the same of its externally contracted partners.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1** Haringey has more than 600 acres of parks, recreation grounds and open spaces. These spaces are a fantastic community asset, which make an important contribution to our overall quality of life and add to the visual charm of the borough. In 2015 20 of our parks were awarded the Green Flag – the national standard of excellence - and together our parks attract 13.5 million visitors each year.
- 2.2** At the same time as looking to reduce the funding, the Council's corporate plan also promises to deliver, as one of its top five priorities, 'a clean, well maintained and safe borough where people are proud to live and work' (Priority 3). A specific objective within this priority is to 'make our streets, parks and estates clean, well maintained and safe'.
- 2.3** We believe that the parks in Haringey have the potential to contribute and add value to the other four priorities, and can help other services to deliver their aims across the entire corporate plan:
- Priority 1: Enable every child and young person to have the best start in life, with high quality education
 - Priority 2: Enable all adults to live healthy, long and fulfilling lives
 - Priority 4: Drive growth and employment from which everyone can benefit
 - Priority 5: Create homes and communities where people choose to live and are able to thrive

3.0 VISION

- 3.1** Parks and green spaces enrich the quality of life for residents, provide places for learning and health outcomes, give opportunities for volunteering and communities, and encourage community involvement and pride in local areas.
- 3.3** The Council is responsible for the Management of the Boroughs Parks, Open Spaces and Housing Estates. This includes the Grounds Maintenance and Hygiene Functions and therefore a range of supplies are purchased by the Council in order to maintain our parks and open spaces to a quality standard.

Therefore, to facilitate the work in the borough and for the purpose of issuing specific requirement for Supplies to the Council, the Council will be using the following Service Categories via the Dynamic Purchasing System:

Service Categories:

- Horticultural Supplies
- Arboriculture Supplies
- Parks Equipment
- Playground Equipment

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS (applicable to all Service Categories)

4.0 Delivery, Storage, and Handling

- 4.1** Suppliers are responsible for ensure all equipment and parts are packed, transported, and handled with utmost care to ensure adequate protection against damage.
- 4.2** The supplier will be responsible for the security of all materials until they are delivered to site and signed for by the Council.
- 4.3** The supplier will use their best endeavours to meet delivery timescales quoted in their submissions to the Councils requirements.
- 4.4** The supplier will be responsible for ensuring the equipment is transported to site and able to be delivered to the ground as no forklift facilities are available.

5.0 Documentation and Service Tools

- 5.1** At the point of delivery, the supplier will provide relevant documentation including test / compliance certificates and maintenance documentation.
- 5.2** In addition, where the equipment being supplied requires bespoke maintenance tools the supplier will include one complete set of maintenance tools and deliver these at the same time as the equipment.

6.0 Contract Monitoring and Quality Assurance

- 6.1** As a minimum requirement the Council will meet with suppliers who hold contracts with the Council, no more that on a quarterly basis, with every fourth meeting

replacing the monitoring meeting with an annual review.

- 6.2** Policy documents that are submitted and self-certified by a supplier on the DPS will be assessed as part of the Council's Contract Management arrangements. Suppliers will be required to update their policies in accordance with new legislation and provide an updated copy to the Council.
- 6.3** The Council reserves the right to decrease or increase the level of monitoring based on the assessment of risk to the Council. In instances whereby the Commissioning Officer makes a decision to deviate from the minimum monitoring standards above the Commissioning Officer will inform the contracted supplier.
- 6.4** Key Performance Indicators will be set by the Commissioning Officer at the Pre-Contract Start meeting.

7.0 Disciplinary, Grievance and Complaints

- 7.1** The Supplier will ensure that they have a robust Disciplinary and Grievance Procedure.
- 7.2** Any formal complaints or grievances received by the Authorised Officer will require a written report from the Supplier as part of the formal investigation into the matter.
- 7.3** All complaints and incidents must be reported by the supplier to the Authorised Officer (or a member of his/her team within the Council) as soon as possible, and no later than 24 hours after the incident/complaint.

PARKS MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT

1.0 General Requirements

1.1 Haringey will only consider machinery lists of a suitable robust design that is suited to heavy trade use (i.e., no domestic grade machinery will be considered). The supplier will also be required to provide an after-sales training scheme for Parks Operatives and Parks Workshop Staff on safe working practices for the machinery.

1.2 All driven machinery must be:

- Legal to be on the road
- Suitably taxed
- Have all warning beacons fitted before delivery
- Of a good condition upon delivery
- No older than 3 years at the start of the leasing period unless otherwise agreed by a council officer
- Must come with the relevant daily / weekly check sheets / logbooks for Haringey staff to complete as required

1.3 Below is a list of the types of machinery the Council will be purchasing, however, this is not an exhaustive list and the Council may on occasion require machinery within this category that have not been listed:

2.0 Repairs and Maintenance

2.1 Suppliers will be required to supply to the Council a repair and maintenance service that includes the following points.

- All Annual / Biannual Servicing needs of Machinery
- Provision for Puncture Repairs & Roadside Recovery
- Cover of all Fair Wear and Tear of items

3.0 Scheduled Servicing of Equipment

3.1 Suppliers must be able to provide a scheduled servicing of equipment which is to be completed at least once over the term of the leased period, this must be pre-arranged between the supplier and a council officer to ensure minimum downtime.

3.2 Scheduled servicing should be carried out on the date and time agreed on site with minimal impact to service delivery. Notification of any failure to meet the agree date and time should be sent to the Council within 24 hours of the agreement.

4.0 Repairs and Breakdown

- 4.1 All Repairs or Breakdowns of machinery should be completed within 24 hrs of notification from the Council to the supplier.
- 4.2 If repairs on site are not achievable within a 24-hr period a replacement (like for like) piece of machinery must be in place within the next 24 hrs. Thus, a turnaround of 48 hrs maximum is allowed.

5.0 Operator Misuse

- 5.1 The council will be responsible for operator abuse upon agreement of damage with a council officer. If a breakdown is deemed to be the result of abuse by Haringey Council staff, a fixed price estimate must be provided to the authority for approval prior to undertaking any works.

6.0 Induction and Inspections

- 6.1 The supplier will ensure Haringey staff are inducted on the vehicle checks on the day of delivery.
- 6.2 The supplier must ensure that a company representative is available on the day of delivery to induct Haringey Staff on the operation and safe working practices of the machinery.
- 6.3 The supplier will ensure they have a representative present on the day of delivery to inspect and sign over the hire machinery to a Council Officer. Any previous or existing damage will be noted and recorded for future reference at this point.

7.0 Hire Terms

- 7.1 Any Hire of Machinery or any change in Machinery Requirements by the Council will be confirmed by a council officer with 7 working days' notice.
